## How to Become a Certified Intervener

Interveners are professionals who assist students with deaf-blindness to actively participate in activities and provide a supportive and effective environment in which the student can learn. The New Jersey Consortium on Deaf-blindness is hosting four training opportunities for individuals who have had prior intervener training, are interested in potentially earning a national certification, and currently working with students who are deafblind. Join us at TCNJ as we work together to change the lives of those with deaf-blindness.



### **Attendance is required all three days.**

If you are a practicing intervener or have participated in intervener training and are serving a deaf-blind student or client, the NICE process provides an opportunity for you to demonstrate attainment of knowledge and skills outlined in the Council on Exceptional Children's (CEC) knowledge and skill competencies for interveners.

During our workshop, we will discuss how to complete the NICE modules, meeting your mentor, Venture, review requirements, and developing and submitting your E-Portfolio.
